

What is a Physical Therapy Residency?

The American Board of Physical Therapy Residency and Fellowship Education (ABPTRFE) defines a residency program as a post-professional learning experience that is structured in a manner to best prepare the resident with the knowledge and skill set to successfully pass the certification exam upon completion of the residency program. It is made of a curriculum which includes the essential knowledge, skills and responsibilities of an advanced physical therapist within a specialty area of practice. Education is provided through structured one-on-one mentoring, curricular experiences, and guided learning which is designed to increase the quality of patient care and practitioner knowledge within that specialty area.



Local Residencies:

Did you know that the state of Connecticut is home to a handful of residency programs? If you are interested in the field of geriatrics, Jewish Senior Services in partnership with Sacred Heart University offers an accredited Geriatric Residency Program. If the field of Orthopedics is an area of interest, there are four accredited programs including Sacred Heart University's Orthopedic Residency Program, Physical Therapy and Sports Medicine Centers' Orthopedic Residency, and Hartford Healthcare and University of Hartford Orthopedic Residency. You can visit the ABPTRFE website for a directory of all residency programs across the nation. Be aware that most residency programs have application <u>deadlines</u> which may be approaching soon. Please visit the individual residency websites listed on the ABPTRFE directory for more details on the programs and reach out to the program directors with any questions you may have.
