The SHU Orthopaedic Residency Program, now celebrating its 15th year, is a 12-month program starting in mid-August each year. We are a universitybased program, working within the SHU DPT program, which allows us to tap into numerous resources at the University. Our curricular content is provided through 6 primary courses delivered over 3 semesters, utilizing blended online, live remote, and live in-person formats. We also have the ability to supplement that didactic content with select orthopedic courses offered through our Physical Therapy Continuing Education Program. Our Residents are also directly involved in teaching in the musculoskeletal labs for our DPT curriculum and have opportunities to perform research and other scholarly projects. Our primary goal through the Residency program is to expedite clinical reasoning and enhance content knowledge and skill to promote expert practice.

The LIVE EVERY DAY Orthopaedic Residency program is 15 months in duration and our goal is to prepare the resident to become an advanced practitioner in orthopaedic physical therapy. We place high value on individualized clinical care with robust 1:1 weekly mentoring. Our residents are offered a full time appointment and we do not charge tuition. Residents are expected to manage a part time clinical caseload with the remaining time allotted for self-paced course work, guest lecture/lab time at Springfield College, leading and attending journal clubs along with attendance to regional and national conferences.
